Battle Cry Inspiration



Battle Cry began in response to a lack of representation of Indigenous voices in media, especially in theater. It's an unapologetic critique of the racism, femmephobia, and fatphobia within the queer community. Most importantly, it's an acknowledgement of Indigenous ancestors who were forcibly removed, silenced, and erased; in particular, Two-Spirit ancestors whose narratives have been straightened and whitened. Without their endurance, strength, and reclamation, Battle Cry couldn't have been written.

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
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
