

No one can take your education away from you. Early in her tutoring sessions with Frank, Rita says of her unsupportive husband, "He can burn me books and me papers, but if it's all in me head, he can't touch it." This is true of traditional education, but it also applies to self-knowledge and personal growth. Any effort you make to better yourself — or space you create for others to do the same — is worthwhile. Nothing is wasted or lost.

"Educating Rita" tells a story of mutual affection and mutual learning. In Frank and Rita's lessons, education is as much about unlearning limiting beliefs and resisting resignation as it is about William Blake's poetry or the tragic ambition of Macbeth. Are you living a life of meaning? If not, what are you willing to risk to start over? You don't need anyone's permission to change course or pursue something new and challenging, but I hope this story encourages you in that direction.

We honor his memory not only with this performance, but with our continued commitment to the magic and meaning of theatre – a passion he so deeply embodied.




